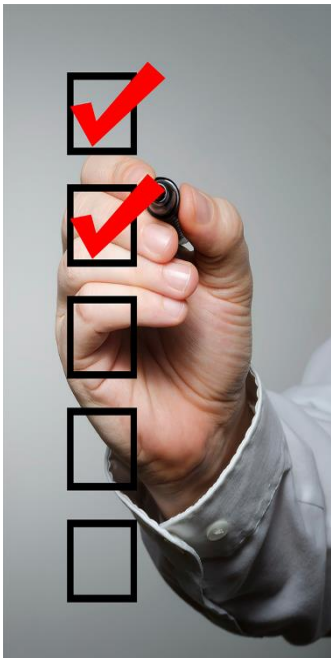




Embracing the Spirit of Pentecost: A Call to Evangelism

USING TECH FOR EVANGELISM



An interview with Sister Bonita Ramacon by the staff of WhatsApp

Interviewer: Good morning, Sister Bonita. Thank you for your willingness to share your innovative approach to personal evangelism using WhatsApp groups. Can you start by explaining the basic idea behind this method?

Bonita Ramocan: Good morning! Thank you for having me. The basic idea is to leverage WhatsApp groups as a platform for personal evangelism. WhatsApp is widely used and allows for real-time communication, which makes it an excellent tool for sharing and discussing key issues related to faith, such as the concept of True Worship

Interviewer: That sounds fascinating. How do you go about setting up a WhatsApp group for this purpose?

Bonita Ramocan: The first step is to identify a target group of people who might be interested in the topic. This could be friends, family, colleagues, or even members of your church who are looking to deepen their understanding of certain aspects of faith. Once you have your list, you can create a WhatsApp group and invite them to join. It's important to clearly communicate the purpose of the group and the topics that will be discussed.

Interviewer: How do you ensure that the discussions remain focused and productive?

Bonita Ramocan: Great question. Firstly, the group is designated a name, which signals the purpose of the group, and further the select persons in my contact list are known by me to want to associate with the group name: for example, "Truth Seekers". I select persons I actually know and have a relationship with. After setting up the group on the platform, it's crucial to set some ground rules for the group. These can include guidelines on respect, staying on topic, and encouraging open, non-judgmental discussions. As the facilitator, you should also prepare a schedule or a plan for the topics to be discussed each week. For example, if the topic is "True Worship," you might start with an introduction to what different religions believe and then move into a discussion about the core tenets of True Worship.

Interviewer: Can you walk us through a typical session in your WhatsApp evangelism group?

Bonita Ramocan: Sure! Let's say the focus is "True Worship." At the beginning of the week, I would post an introductory message explaining the theme and what we aim to explore. I might share a short article, a Bible verse, or a video to kickstart the discussion. Throughout the week, I encourage members to share their thoughts, questions, and experiences related to the topic. Also, as relevant, I utilize links from the FCCOG website, FCCOG facebook page and links to doctrinal resources such as e-booklets from the Church of God movement (former Worldwide Church of God splinters etc.)

Interviewer: How do you handle the diversity of opinions and beliefs that might arise in these discussions?

Interviewer: How do you measure the effectiveness of this evangelism method?

Bonita Ramocan: It's important to foster an environment of respect and understanding. I remind the group that everyone's perspective is valuable and that we are here to learn from each other. If a disagreement arises, I try to guide the conversation back to the topic and encourage members to support their points with scripture or personal testimony. The goal is not to argue, but to explore and understand different views.

Interviewer: How do you measure the effectiveness of this evangelism method?

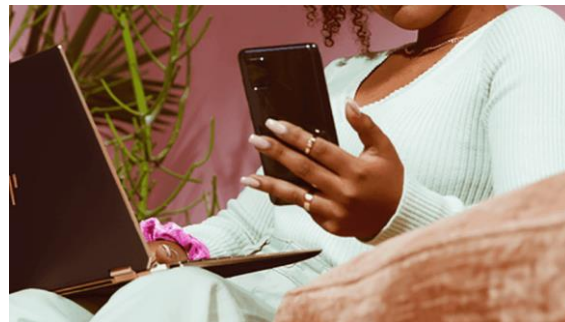
Bonita Ramocan: Effectiveness can be measured in several ways. One key indicator is engagement—how actively are members participating in the discussions? Are they asking questions, sharing insights, and inviting others to join? Another measure is feedback from the group. I regularly ask for their thoughts on the sessions and how we can improve. Finally, I look for signs of spiritual growth, such as members expressing a deeper understanding of their faith or a renewed commitment to their spiritual journey.

Interviewer: What advice would you give to someone who wants to start their own WhatsApp evangelism group?

Bonita Ramocan: My advice would be to start with a clear purpose and a well-defined plan. Know your audience and tailor your discussions to their interests and needs. Be patient and open-minded, and always rely on prayer and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Remember, the goal is to plant seeds of faith and let God do the work of nurturing and growing them.

Interviewer: Thank you so much, Sister Bonita, for sharing your insights with us. It's inspiring to see how technology can be used to spread the gospel in such an effective and personal way.

Bonita Ramocan: Thank you for having me. It's been a pleasure to share this approach, and I hope it encourages others to find new and creative ways to evangelize.
